QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS II FOR 23-31
FOR NATURAL GAS EMERGENCY VALVE REPLACEMENT

1. I know the schedule is to be determined, but just curious if GUC has a timeframe they are looking to get these replacements completed by?

The start and completion dates are flexible based on the contractor's availability. All work must be completed within the upcoming fiscal year (07/01/2023 – 06/30/2024). GUC will work with the contractor to devise a mutually agreeable schedule.

2. The other question is surrounding traffic control/road restrictions. Does GUC foresee limited working hours, night work, or any other limiting factors, or is the anticipation that the work will be able to be completed sunup to sundown?

Emergency Valve #11 and #26 are within the NCDOT Right-of-way. All work performed within the NCDOT Right-of-way shall be coordinated with the NCDOT and shall comply with the NCDOT Right-of-way Encroachment Contract. All lanes of traffic shall be open on thoroughfares from 6:00 AM until 8:30 AM and from 4:30 PM until 6:00 PM on weekdays. Approval must be received by the District Engineer's office prior to any lane closure. GUC will directly coordinate with NCDOT based on the contractor's individual needs at each of the valve locations.

Emergency Valve #138 is within the City of Greenville Right-of-way. All work performed within the COG Right-of-way shall be coordinated with the COG and shall comply with the COG traffic control plan requirements. All lanes of traffic shall be open on thoroughfares from 6:00 AM until 8:00 AM and from 5:00 PM until 6:00 PM on weekdays. GUC will directly coordinate with the City of Greenville based on the contractor's individual needs.
