COUNTY, MUNICIPAL OR HOUSING AUTHORITY

OUTDOOR LIGHTING SERVICE

I. APPLICABILITY

This schedule is applicable to any county or municipality, or to any Housing Authority project created under Chapter 157 of the General Statutes of North Carolina; or any board, agency, or authority thereof for outdoor lighting service, except where installations are prevented by any public authority having jurisdiction or are otherwise unlawful.

II. MONTHLY RATE

\* 400W-T mercury vapor are units controlled by photo cells with timers that cut lights off 6 hours after cut-on, reducing kWh energy consumption.

\*\* 400W-F sodium vapor are floodlight units suitable to light large open areas such as strip development commercial centers and parking areas. These fixtures are not considered suitable for street lighting applications.

All Energy Charges are subject to tracking adjustments as might be reflected by NCEMPA's energy rider. The above Energy Charges include a currently applicable adjustment of 0.00 cents per kWh plus an additional adjustment to recover related system losses.

B. Minimum Charge

The monthly minimum charge shall be the rate specified in II. A. above.

- C. The applicable North Carolina sales tax will be added to all charges listed above, except billings to Federal and State agencies.

III. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The complete installation is to be furnished, maintained and operated by the Commission and will remain the property of the Commission. The type of fixture and method of installation shall be in accordance with Commission standards. Normally, overhead lights will be installed on Commission wood poles or on other wood poles on which the Commission has installed standard attachments. Installations on buildings or structures belonging to the Customer or to others will not be permitted.

The Commission shall not be obligated to construct or own any line extension or other facilities to provide outdoor lighting service, the cost of which shall exceed four times the continuing annual revenue anticipated from any such line extension. If the cost of installing the line extension or other facilities is in excess of four times the anticipated continuing annual revenue, the Customer may be required to pay to the Commission, in advance of the construction of the extension or other facilities an amount equal to the excess cost.

Refer to Greenville Utilities Commission Utility Regulations, Part A, Terms and Conditions of Electric Service, Section 26.0, Outdoor Lighting Service, for additional requirements and restrictions associated with the provision of service under this schedule.

IV. PAYMENTS

Bills are due when rendered, and subject to a 1% penalty if not paid by the due date. For additional information, refer to Utility Regulations, Part D, Customer Service Policy.

Open order where the fixtures and other service facilities are in place. In all other cases, the term of contract shall be as may be mutually agreed upon, but not less than one year.
